SHOWING UP for RCFL... 2019 Fundraising Gala!

RCFL has been 'Showing Up' for our Northside community for 21 years in direct response to the community's ask for attainable housing, youth leadership programming, and workforce development. In 2011 we opened Venture North Bikes & Coffee as a social venture and additional avenue for youth leadership & workforce development. The investment reaches beyond these listed categories.. into health equity via partnership with Fairview and the creation of RCFL's Health Commons @ the Living Room, a thriving community garden, the Due North podcast, and community advocacy work that reaches into the realms of housing justice and racial justice.

On October 5th we will gather together in celebration of all the ways we Show UP for racial justice, health equity, for youth leadership, workforce development, attainable housing, community gardens and community gatherings, for bikes, and for coffee! Last year, we celebrated RCFL's 20th Anniversary with our first ever Gala. Over 200 guests came together to honor 20 years of commitment to our beloved community. We enjoyed music and poetry from Redeemer Community talented artists, stories from long-time RCFL community members, and our generous community raised over \$55,000. Since last October, we have used that financial investment in RCFL to expand programming in the Harrison neighborhood and North Minneapolis at large. We produced our very first podcast, Due North: Stories from North Minneapolis; we hosted 19 Step-Up interns and ran Youth n' Power, a very successful summer camp in partnership with MN Interfaith Power and Light; we took a bike tour around North Minneapolis while learning its history and much more. This year, we'd love to see you at our second annual fundraising gala in support of RCFL! Whether you show up for Venture North, attainable housing, youth programming, the Due North Podcast, workforce development, or equity and inclusion, we greatly appreciate your continued support. Northside Bike Tour

Saturday, August 3, 2019



On August 3rd, we hosted a Northside Bike Ride that began with Cookie Cart cookies and coffee at Venture North and ended with handmade pizza fired in the Harrison-Redeemer Community Bread Oven!

Twenty cyclists of all ages joined for a beautifully sunny Saturday morning ride. Together we traveled west along Glenwood Avenue, around the southern edge of Theodore Wirth lake, north through Theodore Wirth Park, west following the historic Victory Memorial Parkway, and south again through beloved northside neighborhoods. Within this casual ride we took pause to highlight North Minneapolis' rich history, as well as important landmarks, businesses, and non-profit organizations. Our 12 mile ride ended in the beautiful backyard community garden, with handmade pizzas and conversation that pulled together the highlights of our ride, the mission and work of Redeemer Center for Life, and the importance of partnerships rooted in relationship.

This casual ride through North Minneapolis was planned by RCFL board member, Dennis Skovsted, and Jill Griffin in collaboration with Redeemer and St. Michael's Church in Roseville. Neighbors, friends of Venture North, fans of RCFL, Redeemer and St. Michael's church congregants joined as riders and volunteers. This is just how we like to spend a beautiful summer Saturday - good friends, a nice long ride -- intentionally taking in and honoring North Minneapolis history, present day community, and the beautiful landscape -- wood-fired pizza, and engaging conversation. It is by way of events like this that we build authentic relationships that weave the fabric of beloved community.



Venture North - New Leadership & A Change in Schedule

Ian Magnuson joined the RCFL Family in 2017 as a Lutheran Volunteer Corps (LVC) Volunteer dedicated to storytelling and media. At the end of his LVC year, Ian was hired by RCFL as Director of Communications. Ian continued his work at RCFL storytelling through his fabulous photos, designing posters and quarterly newsletters, and creating the 2017 and 2018 Annual Report. This August, Ian stepped into a new role as the General Manager at Venture North.

We sat down with lan to hear more about his role as GM, the future of the shop, and some upcoming changes at Venture North:

How did you first get involved with Venture North?

I first fell in love with Venture North when, as an LVC Volunteer, I was working the Earn-a-Bike Camp. It was amazing seeing all the kids so happy with their brand new bikes. Like our youth participants, Venture North also spurred my obsession with bikes. I actually became a cyclist when I moved here because of my time spent at Venture North. The skills I gained through the shop jump-started my passion for cycling advocacy, service, and coffee.

What do you love about Venture North?

What's really special about Venture North is that when you walk in there isn't any judgement that you might see at a lot of other bike shops. We try to make it a space for everyone, regardless of skill level, age, and any other personal identities. Also, I think that the work we do investing in youth is really attractive because I've never seen programs that just give away free bikes to little kids, like our Earn-a-Bike camp. I also really value the community aspect of Venture North. We try so hard to not only be a successful business but also a successful community space which is maybe more valuable and rare.

What are your goals as General Manager of Venture North?

Overall, I hope to strengthen Venture North not only as a business and social venture but also as a community gathering space. While we have consistently created amazing programs that bring people together for bikes, coffee, and community, there's always room for improvement. We aim to deepen our connection to our mission of making the Harrison neighborhood of North Minneapolis an empowering, healthy place to live by increasing racial, economic, and gender equity within the biking community.

One of my immediate goals for Venture North is to set up an online store where we can sell products to a wider audience and also to continue a consistent social media presence that highlight both the donated bikes we're building and refurbishing as well as the people who make them.

It's particularly important to me that our social media campaign showcases the amazing community we have at Venture North because, while we do make sweet bikes, Venture North's mission is really about the people who make and fix the bikes and bikers who ride the bikes. Working on this social media campaign is a way that I can use my skills as a photographer to show off both our amazing mechanics and our bikes for sale! Over the winter we are having limited hours and are opening our doors on Sundays. Starting Monday, October 14, our new coffee bar hours will be Saturday and Sunday from 9 AM to 4 PM and the bike service will be by appointment only. Why is Venture North changing its hours this winter?

Venture North has been open consistently for 7.5 years, so it's time to update and revamp our aesthetics. For example, we plan to redo the wood floors, deep clean the shop and basement, and move a lot of our products to a new storage location. During this extra time, our staff will also rearrange the showroom space and improve our community programs for the summer season. To recruit more young adults, we plan to visit high school activities fairs and pitch our programs. Throughout this winter hiatus, we plan to host several winter community events like group rides and movie nights and prepare for the next cycling season, so we can be more present at Twin Cities cycling events. When Venture North reopens fully in the spring, we will have a comprehensive calendar for our youth and community programs, as well as new exciting adventures lined up for our mobile bike shop trailer. Personally, I see this winter change in hours as the shop taking a much needed breath so that we can focus on behind-the-curtain aspects of the shop. The goal is that when we resume our full hours in the spring, we will be better positioned to serve the North Minneapolis community.

Last and most important question: what is your favorite coffee drink at Venture North?

I like to order the cafe con miel (espresso, steamed milk, and honey) from new baristas because it's the hardest drink to make.
